Volunteer Reports

- Art Lit:
 - We are in the middle of Monet art project. Art to Rember just launched. There are lots of products to choose from. Order by April 14 and get free shipping to the school. Chagall is last project, kicking off in mid-April.
- Backpack Program: no updates
- Book Fair:
 - Scholastic book fair starts April 21. Runs through April 25. Volunteer requests will go out in early April. Looking for ways to tie in Read-a-Thon.
- Family Nights:
 - Looking at May for a STEM Night. Waiting to confirm a date with Heather. We've confirmed with the Tualatin HS robotics club and are looking to get some of other groups we had last year. Not sure what help is needed yet volunteer-wise.
- Fifth Grade Party and Legacy Project:
 - Planning meeting on April 7 at Jessica Haslam's house. Party is scheduled for Big Al's on June 9th.
- Fundraisers:
 - Pie sale just finished. All pies have been delivered. Raised about \$1881.

- Hanging Baskets: Flyers coming out in a few weeks. Baskets are from Red Berry Barn.
- Lobby Wall:
 - o Kimberly/Krystle to follow up with Kailina on a Read-a-Thon bulletin board.
- Missoula:
 - Everything is on-track. Have hosts for the directors. Cost is \$35/kid and each kid gets 2 tickets.
 Scholarships are also available. 60 students total can participate, and both the form and payment need to be in to secure a spot. Volunteer requests are going out next week. Also, looking for dinner donations for the Missoula staff.
- Read-a-Thon:
 - Planning in the works. Packets go home on April 28. Book give-away is April 29 in the ArtLit room. Read-a-Thon runs from April 30 to May 7. We are using PledgeStar. We are hoping to have an assembly on May 1 where kids can compete in book trivia to generate excitement for the event. Kids will earn cosmic cash for every 2 hours read and after the Read-a-Thon, they can use the cash to buy prizes at a prize store.
- Redemption:
 - o Not much going on. Maybe can have a Bottle Drop can drive related to Earth Day.
- Restaurant Nights:
 - Flyers are going out tomorrow for Pastini on Thursday March 20. Fundraiser is all day but you
 have to mention Byrom. The school gets 40% of those sales. It also works for take-out orders. A
 fun reminder sticker and a post on social media are going out. Want to also include a note: If you

- Staff Appreciation:
 - o No report. Usually it is May 5-9. It often needs lots of volunteer support.
- Webmaster.
 - Do we pay for website? The PSO needs to find a new platform for next year. It is currently an old Word Press site. Lots of options out there. Need to investigate the details on how it is hosted and paid for.

Old Business

- Assembly Ideas:
 - We could possibly use the assembly money for STEM Night if we can't find an assembly. The
 challenge on finding a new assembly now is that they have to be vetted thru the district. Maybe
 check with other schools on who they have used.

New Business

- Garden:
 - Girl Scout Proposal: Troop 110487 wrote a proposal to adopt a portion of the Byrom garden for 2 years from April 2025-2027. The troop would prepare for planting in the spring, properly water, and visit the garden weekly in the growing months to tend and weed. They would also release pollinators in the garden, use resources wisely, and make new signs for the garden. They could access some garden funds for items and the troop can use some of their funds too.
 - Kailina moves to vote on this for the next meeting and Brooke seconds.
 - Question raised on what they will do with the food grown. Proposal says they will donate to the local community but can explore what that can look like. Maybe collaborate with the Backpack Program to include fresh produce.
